

We're Going on a Bear Hunt



Possible topic-based learning opportunities and activities

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Hot seating - Explore feelings. How did the family feel/ how would you feel? excited, happy, worried, nervous, frightened, safe.

What makes us feel...? - discuss feelings/ use scenario cards (sharing/ playing/ helping)

Our bears - Talk about their bears from home, listen to others talk and ask questions of others.

Teddy Bear's Picnic- Make sandwiches with the children. Bring in our bears from home.

What we did at the weekend - slideshow

Games to encourage sharing and turn taking - ball games, What's the Time Mr Wolf, circle time games, board games

Communication & Language

We're Going on a Bear Hunt - explore text. Discuss/ retell/ story maps.

Role-play/ retell story - masks/ stick puppets

Cave role-play area - copies of book, word cards/ labels, masks, stick puppets, resources and equipment linked to the story (binoculars, maps, torches, wellies, blanket)

Our Bears - Follow conversations, listen and respond as children bring in and talk about their favorite bears from home

Small world - include the various textures/ materials from the story - grass, mud, water. Use with small animals - bears/ people.

Listening Area - CD player with headphones. Stories/ songs and rhymes.

Phase 1 and 2 games and songs - Letters and Sounds

Physical

Opportunities to develop gross motor - Mud Kitchen, outdoor games, large apparatus, dance, large chalks, water and brushes, Cosmic Yoga

Themed:

Move like ... tiptoe through the water, run through the long grass ..., stomp like the bear

Bear Hunt - find bears around the school grounds

Mark-making - Using large rolls of paper/wall paper - painting/drawing-use twigs, sticks, leaves, grass.

Explore textures -add materials to paint/ builder's tray/ water tray - sand, mud, grass.

Opportunities to develop fine motor control – play dough, dough disco, tweezer activities, threading, cutting, drawing, writing, painting, tracing activities

Themed;

Use art and craft tools including scissors safely to create bear collages and pictures

Daily story time/ songs and nursery rhymes

Speaking and listening games/ activities - circle time, feely box, small group, one-to-one

What I did at the weekend - slideshow. Camera to go home with children.

Sequencing of events (oral/pictorial)— making sandwiches

Scissors - following lines to bear/ cave/ home.

Tweezer - Use tweezers to add pom-poms on the bear - nose, eyes, buttons.

Painting with textures/ materials from the story - Explore paint and using textured paint - mud and sand. Painting with sticks, leaves, grass.

Action songs and Rhymes - Incy Wincy Spider ...

Literacy

Text: We're Going on a Bear Hunt

Explore the story - role-play, hot-seating, stick puppets, masks. Story map with actions.

Sensory story - use of instruments, materials, actions

Cave role-play area - copies of book, word cards/ labels, masks, stick puppets, resources and equipment linked to the story (binoculars, maps, torches, wellies, blanket)

Read other stories about bears - fiction and non-fiction.

Mathematics

Making sandwiches (Teddy Bear Picnic) following instructions.

Order photographs -

Bear themed games;

Compare Bears

Count sets of bears and compare more/fewer, match numerals to sets.

Counting sets of bears developing 1:1

Adding with compare bears - 1 more/1 less stories (bears in a cave).

2D shape pictures - Use shapes to make a bear shape picture and discuss.

Understanding the World

Making sandwiches - Teddy Bear's Picnic.

Themed Builder's tray - (small world) provide grass, mud, water, animals, people, blocks, shapes

Frozen Ice Sculptures - (using natural materials) - explore/ discuss materials. Look at changes, melting.

Bears- learn about different types of bears. Read non-fiction text/ videos

Lots of large/ small blocks - to explore and create worlds/ caves/ settings

Interactive Whiteboard – Smart Notebook, games, rhymes and songs

Themed Builder's tray - (small world) provide grass, mud, water, animals, people, blocks, shapes

Following recipes/ instructions - making sandwiches for the Teddy Beat's picnic - visual/ oral

Making story booklets

Phase 1 and 2 games - Letters and Sounds

Bear Hunt - Use language of position - linked to 'Bear Hunt'

Bear Pairs game - matching quantity/ digit.

Ordering bears by size - cut and order.

Mud Kitchen – outdoors. Provide cake tins, scales, saucepans, spoons, shovels

IWB - counting games, rhymes and songs

Counting Nursery Rhymes and songs

Camera - child-led

Feely Box - small group activities
